Lutheran Campus Ministry: Conversations That Matter July 24 - 4:30-6:30 p.m.

Family Systems Sessions

There are two remaining Family Systems Sessions this summer:

- Thursday, July 25 1-3 p.m. | Systems and Spirituality: The Self and the Inner Life. Our
 discussion will include the self and ego. As we go deeper, we'll include brain and body, selfdifferentiation, self-integration, soul liminality, the unconscious and shadow, divine
 immanence, and creation.
- Thursday, Aug. 22 1-3 p.m. | Systems and Spirituality: The Self and the Outer World. We'll start with the self and ego as they relate to self-integration, daily life, relationships, communities, and the outer world, including the human elements of cooperation and altruism, competition and selfishness. Expanding our perspective, we'll

explore spirit liminality, consciousness and shadow, serendipity, divine transcendence, universe expansion, and a new creation.

Addiction Ministry 101

Referring people to AA, Alanon and treatment for addiction is helpful, but sound pastoral care is important for everyone in the family. The Rev. Otto Schultz, a retired Lutheran pastor and alcohol and drug counselor, joins us for a discussion of this unique program providing a model of pastoral care and a model of congregational ministry. These models show how sound



theology and good science work together for church and clergy to "let their light so shine" with people and families in trouble with alcohol, drugs and other addictions. This four-part program will provide instruction on five simply communication tools to give exceptional care to families troubled by substance problems and for people in early recovery. This presentation will cover the art of ministering to emotional and spiritual needs at end of life. A hospice chaplain, the presenter will emphasize the importance of clergy, faith community
