

Pastor Joyce Ngandango served as the director of the Huruma Centre Children's Home in Iringa for the past seven years. The facility is home to 40-50 pre- and primary school aged children and serves an additional 50 older students at Iringa Diocese secondary schools and post-secondary education programs. Many of the children who were under her care had experience of neglect, abuse, violence, trafficking and abandonment and

## **Addressing Hunger:**

## **Another Dreaded 'F' Word**

Not too many years ago we were unaccustomed to hearing the "F" word tossed about freely in daily usage and conversation. It was discouraged by parents, teachers, and clergy alike and usually



avoided. After conversation with friends recently, I wonder if there is another "F" word that has, instead, nearly vanished from our daily thoughts and conversation. And how coincidental (God-incidental?) that I recently came upon a United Nations article about that same word! Read it here.

"Famine is the F Word" reminded me that we seldom talk about famine today. We may talk about people who live with hunger, who are food insecure, or who are malnourished. But we don't often read or see in any media about people living in a situation of famine. It appears that we should be!

The U.N. article quotes the UN's World Food Programme estimate that today 309 million people in 72 countries face a level of hunger that is at the crisis level or worse. If I made an effort, I could perhaps list 20 or so countries – beginning with Palestine, Ethiopia, Yemen, and Afghanistan. Now Haiti is added to the list. But 72 countries? One has to ask where? And why? And what can be done about it and by whom?

residential music academy for high school students (grades 8-12) who come together from all over


the country to immerse themselves in musical excellence and build an intentional, supportive and
