



The Reverend of Roller Derby

The sport of roller derby has been around since the 1930s. It's a fast-paced, full-contact sport that Andrew Tengwall calls "poetry in motion."

Using the moniker "Reverend Killjoy (taken from The Simpsons)," Tengwall serves as one of five announcers for the Minnesota Roller Derby (MNRD), which is housed at St. Paul's Roy Wilkins Auditorium. He's more commonly known in church circles, however, as "Pastor Tengwall" because he's one of the pastors in our synod. He currently serves as the interim pastor at Trinity in Lindstrom.



Q: Your derby bio says you're no longer surprised that being a pastor and derby announcer have so much in common. Is that true?

A: Announcing roller derby is a lot like leading worship, in that I'm willing to stand in front of everybody and run my mouth while ultimately pointing everyone toward something much more important than myself or my words. I love being part of the show, but the ringmaster is never the star at the circus. If I do my job well, kids will look up to these skaters as normal people who can accomplish extraordinary things. If I do my job well as a pastor, people will forget about me and instead remember powerful experiences of worship and being close to God and to one another. Also, both church and roller derby have ample opportunities to manage interpersonal conflict, engage in creative problem-solving, and event planning. I will admit that derby afterparties are better than church coffee hour, however!

Where Do We Go From Here? Deep Listening & Racial Justice

Individuals, leaders, and racial justice ministry teams are all encouraged to participate! Engaging in antiracist action demands that we bring our whole selves to our experiences. For this reason, the synod's Advocates for Racial Equity work group and Vitality Team are hosting a morning that focuses on embodied antiracism. This workshop will introduce us to the value of deep listening and teach us practices aimed



at paying attention to what is happening internally within us in racist or racialized situations with the goal of growing our capacity to engage, confront, and question rather than shut down. This is a great session for individuals and for ministry teams interested in racial justice! The featured speaker is **Rachel Svanoe Moynihan**, somatic coach and embodied antiracism leader (formerly with the Center for Leadership & Neighborhood Engagement). 

Through these skills and tools, this workshop will provide confidence to share your faith story and God's story for the sake of a more vital church. The cost is \$20 per person.




ENGAGE Focus

The Faith Community's Call to Caregiving

Thursday, Jan. 23 - 6-8 p.m. | Online

With recent emphasis on aging in place, the faith community is in a key position to answer the call to be or assist caregivers. Faith community nurses are uniquely equipped to meet this call by developing programs, educational initiatives, research, and policymaking. Information, tools, and resources about integrating an age-friendly vision of caregiving with the faith community will be provided. Participants will learn how to support family caregivers and understand the barriers to support in the faith community. While geared toward Faith Community Nurses, others are welcome to attend. SafeTALK Suicide Prevention Training

Saturday, Feb. 8 - 9 a.m.-1 p.m. | Bethlehem, Minneapolis

Learn how to support someone's desire for safety by recognizing the warning signs of suicide, identifying people who are at risk, and applying the TALK steps (Tell, Ask, Listen and KeepSafe) to connect a person to suicide first aid resources. Listed on the national best practice registry, safeTALK allows time for both practice and discussion. safeTALK is based on research that shows people experiencing thoughts of suicide often send out subtle invitations to help them stay safe. This free four-hour class is for members of the community over the age of 16 who want to learn and practice the basic best practices in suicide prevention. The class is hosted by Mental Health Connect, a collaborative of Twin Cities faith communities that work together to help destigmatize mental illness and assist all in finding the help they need.
